Y3 Trip to Butser Ancient Farm

In June, Y3 made the journey down to Butser Ancient Farm in Hampshire. The site includes a number of reconstructed houses based on archaeological evidence that cover the Neolithic period and Iron Age, through to Roman and Saxon times. Our focus was on the earlier periods and the visit gave the children a fascinating insight into how the people lived then and how historians use evidence to formulate ideas. They made some metal jewellery and competed to see which group could make the best wattle fence.

Sports - Cricket

Our Year 5 cricket team played in a tournament at Beddington Park Cricket Club and did very well, winning their first two matches. Unfortunately, they lost the last group match and so did not make it into the semi-final but they all played well, scoring runs and taking wickets and very much enjoyed the experience.

Parent Council – A look back over the year

This time last year our 3rd generation Parent Council group was formed and Miss Evans came on board in her new role as Assistant Head. We have enjoyed being part of this group and getting a better understanding of what the school does for our children and how decisions are made. Since the parent council was set up in November 2014, minutes from our meetings have been discussed within the Governing Body, which gives us a regular slot on their agenda. (All minutes are also available on the school website). It is great that we have this chance to partner with and communicate between parents, staff and governors. We are proud to have been part of the many discussions and wanted to share a few of the highlights of this year.

<u>Celebrations</u>

We make sure we share and celebrate success at the beginning of all our meetings and there have been many such items throughout the year. From class trips to themed weeks, a huge number of parent volunteers in our school, sporting opportunities which are made possible by parental support, success in external assessments, and money raised for and spent on the school, we are hugely proud of what everybody has achieved with and for the children this year.

<u>Continually developing our school</u>

We have discussed issues around parking & children's safety in the surrounding streets with the local council and this conversation will continue. Following request and parental support, some new extra-curricular school clubs have started up this year and the school is always happy to consider new opportunities raised by parents. We are also investigating ways for children from a range of years to become more involved in our local community, for example by supporting a food bank at harvest. Our first project that got off the ground was supporting the London Children's Book Project and collecting nearly 1800 books for children in local schools. Fantastic!

Supporting schools!

In these increasingly challenging financial times we are in the process of drawing up a whole school petition letter opposing the ongoing budget cuts for our school. We have also discussed the use of and contributions to school fund to better support our school.

Every little bit helps

Even minor focuses this year have been made better by our input. Feedback from this years' individual and sibling photos has helped us to compile a list of requirements when choosing a new photographer and volunteers have kindly offered to come & help on photo day to brush hair and straighten collars. Following suggestions lunchtimes have been opened up again this year for parents/carers to come for Reception class, Mothers'/Fathers' Day and a family picnic on sports day. Various workshops for school subjects and children's wellbeing have been offered and the take-up has been good.

<u>Looking forward</u>

We are looking for parent council reps for next year and we'd love to encourage you to put yourself forward to your current parent council rep or the school office so that we can continue to enable parents' views to be heard and partner with the school for the success our children. Whatever your dreams for your children, it starts here, with no more than six or seven meetings per academic year!
