# School Dinner Money

A reminder the school has recently changed the lunch payment policy from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2018. The reason for this change is that the catering company have become aware that several of our accounts are in arrears and this cannot continue to happen as it places additional financial pressure on the school.

# If your child has school meals, or will be taking school meals next half term, these should be paid for half a term in advance, inclusive.

To remind you the cost of a meal is £2.25 per day, £11.25 per week. So if your child will be having school dinners every day for the next half term, please pay £65.25 into your ParentPay account at the beginning of the school term, or if your child has two school dinners a week, it'll be £27.00 to prepay. Even if your child only has a meal once or twice a week, please pay for the individual days in advance. Meals should be paid for via ParentPay and should your account not have the correct balance, you will be contacted daily to confirm that your child is having a school dinner. If you have not yet registered with ParentPay, please contact the School Office. If you decide that your child no longer requires a school meal, please inform the school office and pay any arrears.

#### <u>Netball</u>
