

Headteacher's Comment

It has been an exciting week with our focus on Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths - STEM subjects. Mrs Vinson initiated and led this week, which involved all years learning about flight, from making kites in YR to creating history of flight posters in Y6. All of this was inspired by the falconry display on Friday 25th January and culminated in a whole school carousel on Friday 1st February when each class travelled around the school, taking part in a different STEM learning activity in each classroom.

I have thoroughly enjoyed meeting many parents during the 'Coffee and Cake' sessions held during the past four weeks. Thank you for all the positive comments as well as suggestions for areas of development across the school. I intend to include some of these suggestions in our school development plan which will be available to view on our website within the next two weeks.

Y5 Visit to Sri Raj Rajeswary Aman Temple

On Monday 28th January, Year 5 visited the local Hindu temple in Stoneleigh, "Sri Raja Rajeswary Amman Temple". As part of our RE curriculum this term, we have been looking at different aspects of the Hindu religion. This visit allowed and enabled the children to explore the Hindu culture, developing on their prior knowledge and understanding and deepen this through excellent questioning (questioning which both I and the people at the temple were extremely impressed by).

"The temple was called Sri Raja Rajeswary Amman Temple. Our guide was called Saidhanya. We were shown around the gods and goddesses which the Hindu's worship at the temple." Josh

"When we entered the temple, we had to take our shoes off as a sign of respect to the gods and goddesses. All of the gods and goddesses have animal companions. Lakshmi, the god of wealth and purity, has an elephant as her animal companion." Mia

"The chariot festival is where Hindu's gather from all over the country, and some from other countries, to parade with a chariot and the goddess to keep everyone safe and happy. People smash coconuts and Saidhanya told us that this was because the coconut symbolises our heart - a hard exterior and soft inside. By smashing it, we break away that hard outside and allow the soft side to pour out." Liam

As mentioned above, their thought-provoking questions and discussions were extremely impressive and I think all of us (children and adults) learnt a huge amount from this visit.
